Ian Plansker is a 13 year old flautist from Grosse Pointe Park. Ian has been playing flute for three years and currently studies with Sharon Sparrow. He has won multiple awards including first place in the winds division of Tuesday Musicale's Student League Competition, first place in SEMFA's Rachel Stornant Junior Artists Competition, and an opportunity to perform one of his composition at the MMEA Honors Composition Concert. He has played with the DSO's Youth Wind Ensemble and Philharmonic as well as the Wind Ensemble and Orchestra at Grosse Point South. Aside from the flute, Ian enjoys Japanese, piano, composition, and ballet.

Tuesday Musicale of Detroit Scholarship Award

Anita Dumar is pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in Violin Performance at the University of Michigan, and studies with Professor Danielle Belen. She attended high school in Oklahoma, studying violin under Michigan alumnus, Dr. Gregory Lee, and received awards in multiple statewide competitions, including the Overall Strings prize at the OKC Buttram Competition. Her freshman debut performance at Michigan was as a winner of the Ann Arbor Camerata Competition. Most recently, she was a semifinalist in the 2016 Sphinx Competition, and this summer represented Detroit and the Midwest at the NANM Competition's National Round, receiving third prize. She is also a member of the newly founded Ivalas Quartet, which was named the inaugural String Quartet Fellows at the 2017 Anchorage Chamber Music Festival. Anita plays on a 1900 Bailley violin provided by a scholarship grant from the Virtu Foundation.

Baritone **Michael Floriano** is currently a Master's student at the University of Michigan where he has been seen as Demetrius in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Last summer Michael was part of the Studio Program at Central City Opera where he sang Joe in John Musto's *Later the Same Evening*, as well as Albert in *The Ballad of Baby Doe*. Other credits include Tarquinius in *The Rape of Lucretia*, Anthony in Sweeney Todd, Count Almaviva in *Le Nozze di Figaro* and Mr. Jones in *Street Scene*. An avid recitalist, Michael recently performed Schubert's *Die Schöne Müllerin* at the Kerry Town Concert Hall in Ann Arbor. Upcoming performances include Oliver in William Bolcom's recently premiered opera *Dinner at Eight*, as well as a performance of Mahler's *Lieder eines farenden Gesellen*. Michael is also a graduate of Oberlin Conservatory and the Janiec Opera Company at the Brevard Music Center.

A native of Sugar Land, Texas, **Evan Hines** graduated from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in 2016 with a degree in piano performance with an emphasis on collaboration. He pursued solo studies under the tutelage of Sanford Margolis and Alvin Chow, and his collaborative studies were guided by Philip Highfill and James Howsman. While at Oberlin, Hines performed in master classes for Boris Slutsky, and Martin Katz. Hines is currently pursuing a Master's degree in collaborative piano at the University of Michigan under the instruction of Martin Katz.
